

Florida Vegetable Book

Materials:

Paper lunch bags (at least 3 per student)

Brads

Colored pictures of Florida commodities

Scissors

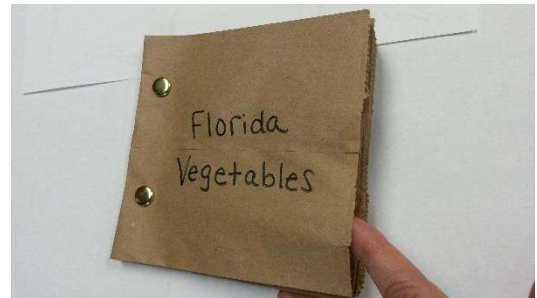
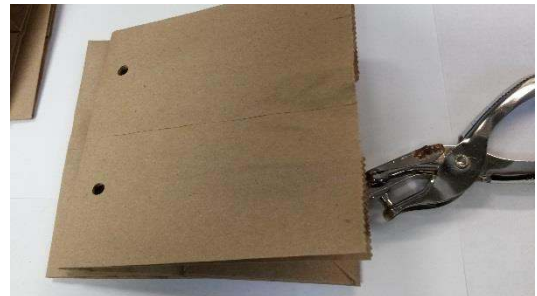
Hole puncher

Glue

Index cards – 3”x5”

Instructions:

- 1) Fold each bag in half
- 2) Place three folded bags on top of each other. The open end of the bag should be on top of each bag.
- 3) Punch two holes in the folded end of each bag in the same place on all three bags.
- 4) Place a brad in each of the holes to hold all three bags together.
- 5) On the front write “Florida Vegetables”
- 6) You will need one bag per commodity. Cut out colored pictures of commodity and glue them onto the inside of the open end of the bag.
- 7) Have student research food items created from the vegetable. For example, if corn is selected, students may come up tortilla chips, corn flakes, corn dogs, etc. They will print out those pictures and glue the picture to an index card. The index card can now be slipped into the open end of the bag behind the corn picture.



8) It is up to you and your students to decide what picture they will put on the closed end of the bag. They can write a poem about their favorite food made from that commodity, find a great recipe or neat science experiment that uses the vegetable.



9) Repeat for the other bags in the book.
